Particulars of an inquest held at Moray,
free Caledonia on Sunday, the 10th day of
October 1869 on the body of one

Levi Walker who was drowned while
bathing in the Caledonia River at about
half past twelve noon on the above date.

The body having been inspected - the
following evidence is taken

1st Witness

Thomas Atkins labourer being sworn
deposes - I am a labourer on Mr Raff's
plantation. I know the deceased, he was
a labourer on this plantation - I went
with him & two others, John Halloran &
Murdock McLeod to bathe in the river
about a quarter past twelve noon - I was
in the water when deceased jumped off
the bank and dived in as if he was a
good swimmer, the tide carried him down
wards as soon as he came to the surface,
I ~~heard~~ heard him muttering & went to him
he threw his arm round me, and we
both went down, I am not a good swim-
mer and I had to save myself as
best I could & did not see him again
till he was brought ashore -
